

Pastor's Pulpit:

It's a brand-new Year and . . . we have a brand-new church slogan:

"Come Alive in `25 with 105"

We also have some new people coming on to serve our Board and our committees and our teams. What's more, for only the second time in our history, we have a president who will be serving two non-consecutive terms. I think I will just wait and see how things go. Speaking of do-overs, isn't that what the beginning of a new year is really all about? Just taking time to look back over the past 12 months to ponder, reflect and question how things went. Some things went well and others went very well. Yet, there were several things that I wish I could have as do-overs. So here are **5** items that I'm going to try, and I mean try, to react differently when they come up and hopefully this time will get it right.

Number 1:

I am really going to try to major on the majors, and not fall into the trap of majoring on the minors and minoring on the majors! Some things tend to get blown out of proportion and when it gets down to it, they really shouldn't. Other things I may overlook and it's those items that needed my attention. I do want to get this right! Major on the majors and yes, minor on the minors. Not the other way around!

Number 2:

Not judging people just on their personality and not taking the time to consider God's purpose for them being in my life. As a child of the King myself, I am called to love all folks. God puts all sorts of people in our lives for the sole intent of shaping us and honing us to be more like His Son, our Savior and spiritual Brother, Jesus Christ. Purpose over personality. It's a toughie, but I just need to accept the fact that God is working out a specific plan for all of His kids, and we just need to accept the fact that we need each other, maybe not want, but need. Yep, purpose over personality.

Number 3:

Along that same vein, try to remember not only who people are but ... **Whose** people are. Even unsaved people can be chosen ones of God. It just hasn't happened yet. They are not at that place yet where God is going to draw them to Himself and change their lives, hearts and destines. In reality they are His, they just don't know it! And neither do I. So, I think I'll just assume that everyone I meet is God's kid, whether now or later. At t the same time, there are those who are true kids of the Most High but have let themselves become distant from God because of health, or worry, or immaturity, or struggles with temptation, or bitterness or disappointment and so on. They are living well below their true calling and not acting near their level of privilege ... but **"Whose**" they are, never really changes. Who they are at this point may not resemble their true identity, but for me I want to always keep in mind, that it's the "**Whose**" that's the most important.

Number 4:

This is one of the challenging ones. I really do want to become more of a learner, than simply a listener. I deal with so many facts and texts when I research that I can gain only a superficial knowledge of whatever subject I'm trying to understand. I'm in such a hurry to get things put together that I often miss the deeper lessons. I need to go more for substance and *learn* what I am trying to investigate. If I don't, then it will be like people who only hear what they want to hear and basically tune out and settle more for the subjective superficial than the true truth of the matter. Lord, give me a hunger to learn not just listen. Help me to be a student who puts into practice what I take the time to know.

Number 5:

Make decisions based on what I know and not simply on how I feel. You know I think it's OK to react to something in such a way as to not have the reaction be the end of the story. In other words, whenever something comes up that someone may point out, I may not like it and initially react poorly. But then I usually have, given some time, think about the issues based more on the truths the person may have been sharing. Bitterness about things will literally eat you alive. And to be quite frank I refuse to let bitterness dig its deadly roots into my heart. Think David, think. Think through situations. Search for truth based on scripture, and have a Christian mind and heart-set. Allow yourself to do as you preach and consider everything but asking W.W.J.D. (Wha Would Jesus Do).

So, there you have it. 5 do-overs I'm going to be seeking to improve on. How about you? Does anything need to be addressed? Any action need to be taken. Any attitude need to be challenged and changed? Any one need to reconciled with. Most of life is all about stumbling then getting back up and trying again. Do-overs are more of a sign of strength than a reason to feel defeated. Pray for me that I'll do better in my areas, and I'll pray for you for God to lead you and help you as you deal with yours.


