Pastor's Pulpit:

If we have faith in Christ, we've been set free from slavery to sin—even our complaining! We've been liberated by a sacrifice: the shedding of Christ's blood on the cross. And we too have set out on a journey, not to Canaan but to heaven. In light of that, God has given us both wonderful promises and necessary warnings. Do not presume upon His provision or grumble about the route He leads you on, but instead be filled with gratitude for all He has provided materially and spiritually. The cross lies behind you, heaven lies before you, and the Spirit dwells within you. There is no need, or excuse, for grumbling. --Allister Begg

I love that quote because it reminds me not to be so nitpicky or overwhelmed when life throws a curveball. What is the secret to keeping a positive attitude and a grateful heart? During Lent, we contemplate the utter sacrifice Jesus made on our behalf to be in a right relationship with the God from whom we were once estranged. Jesus said, *"All things have been entrusted to Me by My Father. No one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and those to whom the Son chooses to reveal Him. Come to Me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls." (Matthew 11:27-29). He went on to say, <i>"I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty."* (John 6:35).

I think one of the most important things to consider during the Lent season is how *do* we come to Him and more, how *can* we draw our spiritual sustenance from this One who refers to himself as our Bread of Life? Let me share with you 5 basic ways we can do both:

e about the Lord's Business! So many things in life are uncertain but one thing I do know, the Lord wants us to be about the business of personally witnessing about Him and corporately making Disciples for Him. Think about it, the very last thing He told His disciples before His ascension was, *"Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you."* (Matthew 28:19-20). As we focus more on Him and His purposes, we see our lives from a different perspective. We know that we are privileged to be involved in a work and ministry bigger than us. Of course, to be about His business we need to draw not only close to Him but also to draw courage from Him. Be about the Lord's business! Next —

ead, Read, Read then ... Rely, Rely and Rely ... on the promises found in the Scriptures! Reading the Bible really is like consuming food for our hearts and souls. In them God speaks, directs, comforts, and challenges those who are His true, adopted children. After all, we don't call the Bible the Word of God without reason. David understood this when he said, "*Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path.*" (Psalm 119:105). John records the words of Jesus, "*I have given them your word and the world has hated them, for they are not of the world any more than I am of the world. My prayer is not that you take them out of the world but that you protect them from the evil one. They are not of the world, even as I am not of it. Sanctify them by the truth; your word is truth." (John 17). Finally, Jeremiah the prophet encourages us: "Your words were found and I ate them, and your words became to me a joy and the delight of my heart. For I am called by your name, O Lord God of hosts." (Jeremiah 15:16). Be about the Lord's business! Read, Read, Read then Rely, Rely and Rely on the Promises found in the Scriptures! Then —*

njoy life's Dilemmas! I know this sounds strange but there really is some truth in it. James records these words in the first chapter of His book: "Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance. Let perseverance finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything." Let's face it. Trials and problems have the ability to either drive us **FROM** God or **TO** God. Sometimes it just takes time for us to get over our FROM issues before making it back to our TO posture. No problem is enjoyable, but almost all problems are doable. Given time, given hope, being about God's business and being saturated in His Word makes us rely more and more on God. "If you don't fix this Lord is just won't get fixed." Ever said that? I have! And it does seem that many times the Lord is just waiting for me to get to this point before He takes over. If my problems can drive me TO God, then in a way, I really can enjoy life's dilemmas ... sorta. (Still working on this one myself!) Next —

Iways try to act and react in a spirit of love! During Lent, we are deliberately more remorseful and contrite as we consider the upcoming Holy Week and all that transpired before Christ was resurrected on Easter morning. This attitude should push us to be more sensitive to the real problems and plight of folks around us. I love the illustration by R. C. Sproul about who we should love:

I know a Christian counselor who once had a man come to see him who wanted to divorce his wife. As his reason, the man said: "My wife wasn't unfaithful. She hasn't left me or anything like that, but I just don't love her anymore." The counselor said to the man: "Well, the Bible says, 'Husbands, love your wives.' So, you don't have an option. This is the command of Almighty God. You have to start loving your wife." The man responded: "You don't get it. I don't even want to be around her. I don't want to live in the same house with her." At this point, the counselor said: "Why don't you do this? Why don't you have a trial separation and move next door for a few weeks?" The man asked, "What good will that do?" (Continued on next page) The counselor responded, "Well, the Bible says, 'Love your neighbor,' and now she'll be your next-door neighbor." The man was getting more and more exasperated with the counselor. He said: "You don't get it. It's not that I don't want to be near her—I can't stand the sight of her. I have nothing but enmity in my heart towards her." "Oh," said the counselor, "she's your enemy?" After the man answered in the affirmative, the counselor responded, "Well, the Bible says, 'Love your enemies."" I think that fellow went to a different counselor the next week.

Or in other words, try, at least try, to be as loving and thoughtful as you can during this Lenten season. Trying to love yes ... even your enemies. Jesus did say, "But I say to you who hear: Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, and pray for those who spitefully use you." (Luke 6). Always try to act ... and react in a spirit of love! And finally —

evote yourself 100% to carrying out God's will for your life! Paul wrote these words in 1 Thessalonians 5:18: "Thank [God] in everything [no matter what the circumstances may be, be thankful and give thanks], for this is the will of God for you [who are] in Christ Jesus [the Revealer and Mediator of that will] ." (AMPC). We

strive to remember this Lenten season:

Christ's awesome sacrifice to bring us to the Father, to be born again, to know and walk with God, to be indwelt by His Holy Spirit, to be able to draw strength from His Word as we ponder and study, to know that we are in the end going to be in heaven with family, friends, angels, and Christ himself. These should be the realities on which we base everything else in our life. Sometimes I feel like I need to give myself permission to be happy! How about you? I need to remember that He is in control and nothing happens that He does not ultimately allow and ordain.








UNION WITH CHRIST

In Union with Christ, Dr. Sinclair Ferguson surveys one of the Apostle Paul's favorite phrases to describe the essence of the Christian life: being "in Christ." This twelve-part teaching series explores what it means to be "in Christ" and how these two simple words can reshape our entire existence.


"Blessed be the Lord, who has delivered you." - Exodus 18:10

With that introduction, we enter into the story of the Hebrew people in the Book of Exodus. No longer under the protection of their forefather Joseph, the children of Israel became slaves to the Egyptians. But God was raising up a deliverer in Moses, to lead His people from bondage to freedom so they could worship Him.

The exodus of the Israelites shapes our understanding of the whole Bible, its themes reverberating all the way to Revelation. Exodus is the birth narrative of a nation unmistakably guided by the Great Deliverer.

In this 10-session verse-by-verse study of Exodus 1–18, Jen Wilkin shows us that Israel's story is our story: the same God who delivered Israel also delivers all those He loves from slavery to sin and from service to the pharaohs of this world. He lifts our eyes to the promised land He has prepared where we dwell with I AM and worship Him as the one true God.
