Pastor's Pulpit:

R. C. Sproul makes an interesting comment in his little book, "Why Should I Join a Church ... redemption is not a group activity." In the end, when we stand before almighty God, we will stand alone. Our brothers, sisters, father, mother, friends, nation, club or church will not avail us when we stand before God. God will deal with us as individuals; and it is as individuals that we will enter the Kingdom of God.

But we can't confuse that reality with individualism. When Jesus redeems an individual, He places him or her into a group, and He calls that group His own body. How in the world can a person love Christ and hate His body? How can a person embrace Christ for any period of time and continually absent themselves from fellowship with the company of

God's people ... the family of God? Sinclair Ferguson picks up on this conversation by noting, "we are apparently supposed to pray the Lord's prayer daily ... give us this DAY, our DAILY bread ... but notice that it's not give ME my daily bread, but rather give US our daily bread." Even at the beginning of the prayer, it's "OUR Father ... who art in heaven." Christ has so set up His church that when we come to close to Him, we naturally come close to one another.

Our particular church family, as you know, has within it three separate denominations: American Baptist Church, United Methodist Church and Presbyterian (USA). In the plural, the word denomination actually is defined as: "a recognized, autonomous branch of the Christian Church." Denominations which are recognized as an established, legitimate, time-tested, and policy-adhering group of Christians, but are autonomous in their ability to come down slightly different on various views (on subjects such as membership, view of scriptures, sacraments, beliefs about heaven and hell, leadership structure). Yet still being Christian, they hold firmly to the fundamental beliefs concerning: the Omnipotence, Omniscience, and Omnipresent realities of a Holy God; Christ's redeeming work of salvation; the place of the Holy Spirit as a sign and a seal of that salvation; and the importance and need of discipleship, fellowship, evangelism and prayer. Each of our denominations is a little different. All have their many strengths and of course, each has their areas which make them unique.

There are some people who say that they love our church family, that they give and support and are involved in the church, but if there was a category for non-affiliated people, they would join. I get that, to a degree. But even if we incorporated a "category" for non-affiliated members, that group would in itself become, and end up being, a denomination. Think about the definition of denomination: a recognized, autonomous, branch of the Christian church. Of course, the "non-affiliated" would still have a structure, a settled set of beliefs, a perspective concerning certain elements of worship, and so on. For some people it is simply a matter of not to have to be part of any denomination, not realizing that that is really what they are insisting on having themselves. As a pastor, my heart is heavy because for some of these folks it's not just a matter of denominations and the need to choose, as it is simply the freedom to not have to choose. Which by the way is not Christ's view, nor is it His intention for His church, His people to look like, or operate as. With all that said, it's just a thought to ponder.

We are offering again this year, a time to consider and make a decision concerning church membership. On Palm Sunday, we will be hosting a New Member Question & Answer Time following our worship service. Here we will consider the differences and the leanings of each of our denominations. We have spotlighted the denominational basics throughout the first three months of the year. Each denomination has attempted to put their best foot forward in sharing who they are, what they believe, what they actually do and how to join. We then will welcome all who have chosen to join the opportunity to become an official part of our collective and diverse church family the following week on Easter Sunday. We would love for you to join us and be a part of what God is continuing to do in us and through us here in our beloved, 102-year-old congregation.
