

FOOD PANTRY CLIENT PROFILE:



Isaiah walked the streets naked as God had instructed (Isa: 20) to warn the city of impending doom. Ezekiel used many techniques to communicate God's message in visions and puns such as eating a scroll (Eze: 3), laying restrained on each side for an entire 430 days (Eze:4), and shaving his head and burning his hair (Eze:5). I cannot follow Ezekiel's or Isaiah's methods but I desire to fulfill Jesus' great commission (Mk:16:15) in a much simpler way.

Now that the basement room is available, our United Church youth group will be hosting a program on **Thursdays from 4pm-6pm**. This will be an afterschool community outreach to kids 13 years old and up outside our church family. They will share God's Word through games and fun activities.
