Pastor's Pulpit:

Ecclesiastes 3:1-8 (New International Version)

There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under heaven: a time to be born and a time to die, a time to plant and a time to uproot, a time to kill and a time to heal, a time to tear down and a time to build, a time to weep and a time to laugh. a time to mourn and a time to dance. a time to scatter stones and a time to gather them, a time to embrace and a time to refrain, a time to search and a time to give up. a time to keep and a time to throw away, a time to tear and a time to mend, a time to be silent and a time to speak. a time to love and a time to hate, a time for war and a time for peace.

And I might add ... a time in South Dakota to get outside and do things ... and a time to settle in for the winter. We all know and live with the reality that winters here in our beloved town are long and summers are relatively short. For the most part, people do take advantage of the warm weather to get outside and go places.

As the writer of Ecclesiastes penned, there really is a time for everything. Being a Christian also incudes various seasons in life: a time to toil and a time to rest; a time to be busy in church and a time to take a break; a time to pick up a new ministry and a time to lay one down. But, I might add, in the Christian faith, there really has never been a time to be faithful in going to church and a time to take off three or four months. It is a temptation, I know. Here in our neck of the woods, summers are so very short. And let's face it, lots of people travel and are gone for a lot of the summer months. It's just a reality.

In your walk with Christ, have you considered the validity and demands of the Great Commission? Here it is in Matthew 28:18-20: *"And Jesus came and said to them, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me."* ¹⁹ Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

"All authority" ... "Go and make" ... "I am with you always"? What's interesting is the actual translation from the Greek into English. Bob Prall in his little Kindle book comments: "Most translations of the Great Commission (Matthew 28:18-20) render it as if we are commanded to go. In the original Greek, the imperative is to make disciples. The word go could be translated "as you are going."

God may send you to a particular place to fulfill a special ministry. But, as a Christian, you have been called to witness for Jesus Christ wherever you are right now ... and for the rest of your life. So, wherever you are going, whenever you are going, and for whatever reason you are going, your assignment is always the same — *As You are Going* — *Make Disciples*. Pretty cool stuff. It's not meant to dampen your summer fun or better yet, spoil your trip to your beloved relatives' homes. It's just a reminder of who and Whose you really are. And more, what in fact we are to be all about...as we are going.

The only problem is most of us feel so very unprepared in what to say and when to bring up ... "Jesus talk." As such, we simply avoid the subject all together. And we come back home and feel poorly for not being the kind of witness for Christ, and about Christ, that down deep inside we long to be. If that's you, then let's consider a plan of action. Let's just enjoy the summer: travel, be out and about, spend time with loved ones, and do as many things as possible. Then come September 4, at 11:15 am, let's make the decision to come to the *Organizational Meeting for the Disciple to Disciple* (D2D) *Class* that Pastor and others offer.

Let's consider spending the Fall, Winter and early Spring in the business of learning how to be about the Lord's business as we are going. Let's consider learning and developing the basics of spending time with the Lord in Bible study and prayer. Let's consider sharpening our own stories of how and why we have to come to know that Jesus really is real. And then let's also consider perfecting various ways of sharing the true Gospel message in a way that makes sense not only to others but to us as well ... as we are going. It's called being a disciple. And I believe it's what the Lord commanded and commissioned us to do, both as His church and His cherished Child.

There really is a time to play and there really is a time to work. But just as important, there is a time to be ministered to and there is a time to learn how to minister to others. D2D just gets us as a congregation on God's page; doing what He wants and being who He is shaping us to become. There is a time to read articles and there is a time to put this one down and go have some fun.
