Pastor's Pulpit:

July is the seventh month of the year and has 31 days. Named in honor of Julius Caesar, it marks summer continuation in the North, and winter in the South. This period brings prolonged daylight in the Northern Hemisphere, and longer darkness in the Southern Hemisphere.

The main days you should know about for July are:

July Mission Emphasis Ethnos 360 — Walter & Cheryl Spicer

Ethnos360 is a missionary organization that supports many missionaries working in various capacities. The United Churches' support of **Ethnos 360** goes specifically to **Walter and Cheryl Spicer**, who serve in the **Republic of the Philippines.**

The Spicer's have been missionaries with Ethnos 360 (formerly called New Tribes Mission) for 31 years, teaching MK's (Missionary Kids) in the Philippines. They serve at Faith Academy (FA) where Cheryl is a school nurse and Walter has had several different ministries, including math teacher, NILD therapist (teaching children with learning differences), middle school counselor, vice-principal, and middle school principal. Their ministry is a vital part in advancing God's Kingdom in Southeast Asia. They finished their last home assignment in July 2019 and are presently serving at Faith Academy Cheryl as a school nurse and Walter as the Deputy Head of School (the assistant to the Head of School).

The importance of those who serve MK kids sometimes is overlooked. A close family friend of mine developed recognition in the field of MK kids through her thesis and book, when she worked with MKs in the college setting.

It is fantastic that we support Walter & Cheryl Spicer in their work on the mission field. Walter is the nephew of Pearl Risinger a member of United Churches who passed away a few years ago. Walter and Cheryl were last here in 2019 during their home assignment. **Our Loose Change Offering for July will be gathered on Sunday, July 9th. Then we start the summer running. The very next week is our NTCP Conference (in the Philippines we are known as New Tribes Church Planters) with our fellow missionaries. It will be the first time getting together in over three years, so we are excited! Immediately after the conference, is a Peer Debriefing class that we will both attend.

Pray for the safe delivery of Ashley's baby in June. Pray that the baby would turn as she is still in a breech position. With the low amniotic fluid level, the doctor is not sure if she will turn. We are excited that Cheryl will return to the US for one month to see this wonderful event. Pray for safe flights and quality time. Cheryl will see most of our adult children, plus Cheryl will spend time with her parents.

Pray for Walter as he remains in the Philippines. He will be busy at school as most of the other Administrators will be gone for the summer. Several of the departments under him will be busily preparing for the new school year.

But it is vacation time for students, so Walter is planning some fun activities with the Butterfly girls. Pray that he and the caregivers will create a memorable/fun break for all of the girls.

As we wind down this school year and prepare for the next school year, pray that we will imitate Mary and NOT Martha—we need to spend time sitting at the feet of Jesus (Luke 10:41-42).

And the rocket's red glare, the bomb bursting in air, Gave proof through the night that our flag was still there, O say does that star-spangled banner yet wave O'er the land of the free and the home of the brave?

On the shore dimly seen through the mists of the deep Where the foe's haughty host in dread silence reposes, What is that which the breeze, o'er the towering steep, As it fitfully blows, half conceals, half discloses? Now it catches the gleam of the morning's first beam, In full glory reflected now shines in the stream, 'Tis the star-spangled banner - O long may it wave O'er the land of the free and the home of the brave!
