Pastor's Pulpit:

October is upon us. Halloween, Thanksgiving and Christmas all lay before us in this last quarter of the year. Where has the time gone? October is also Pastor Appreciation Month. Let me share with you what I would consider *one-half* of the story in a short article from Christianity.com. What Is Pastor Appreciation Day and Clergy Appreciation Month?



What Is Pastor Appreciation Day and Clergy Appreciation Month?

"October has long been recognized worldwide as Pastor Appreciation Month, or Clergy Appreciation Month. The call to honor our church leaders' contributions can be traced back to St. Paul. In establishing the first Christian churches, St. Paul advised the congregation to give "double honor" to the elders of the church who managed the affairs of the church well, "especially those whose work is preaching and teaching" (1 Timothy 5:17).

St. Paul further urged Christian communities to acknowledge those "who work hard among you, who care for you in the Lord and who admonish you," holding these spiritual leaders "in the highest regard in love because of their work" (1 Thessalonians 5:12-13). In 1994, the American Christian organization Focus on the Family began promoting Clergy Appreciation Month as a national month of observance. In highlighting Clergy Appreciation Month, Focus on the Family sought to encourage the faithful to outwardly show their appreciation for religious leaders on a national level.

When Is Pastor Appreciation Day?

From Pastor Appreciation Month grew the idea of emphasizing one specific day to nationally pay tribute to our clergy. This day became known as Pastor Appreciation Day. Also referred to as Clergy Appreciation Day, this day of showing national gratitude for clergy members is celebrated on the second Sunday in October. In [2022], Pastor Appreciation Day will be Sunday, [October 9TH].

Why It's Important to Celebrate Pastors and Clergy Members

As of mid-2018, there are approximately 51,000 people in the United States who are officially employed as clergy. When we consider all that religious leaders do, it becomes clear how important it is to celebrate and uplift our hardworking clergy."

That's all nice ... and I so appreciate the sentiment that goes into having such a day. Half the story is the appreciation of congregations for their pastors. The *other half of the story* is the appreciation pastors have for the people they have been given the privilege of being their pastor. So for my Pastors Appreciation Month I've decided to focus on **6 things** that I truly appreciate about all of **U!**

First, I appreciate the fact and the blessing that you are . . .

Not a divisive-minded congregation. Let's face it, with three denominations sharing one building there could be unbelievably contrasting views about polity, polices and theology. But, it's not like that here. Nor has it been for 103 years. What a true blessing for any pastor to come into a situation where people really have learned the art of not majoring on the minors or minoring on the majors. It's truly shows a quantity of Christian character that I really am appreciative of and thankful for.

Second, I appreciate the fact and the blessing that both . . .

and Bernice have been wonderfully and graciously welcomed and accepted by both our church and the community. A large part of any Pastor's discerning process in deciding to take a pastoral position is "how is this move going to affect my spouse." Let's face it, if mama isn't happy then ... well, you know the rest. Bernice is genuinely happy and involved in more things here than I have seen her for a long time. I think she's happy and well you know what that means.

Third, I appreciate the fact and the blessing that there seems to be a true desire to spend quality . . .

Time in fulfilling the four aspects of being a congregation: time in prayer, time in worship, time in fellowship and time in reaching out to others. I would consider this congregation to be healthy in so many ways. So much so, that there does seem to be and awareness of and an acceptance of new things, if they will be helpful to our church family. What a blessing!

Fourth, I appreciate the fact and the blessing that there really is . . .

Evidence of Christ's presence in and among our congregation. I really do sense that Christ is moving not only in our worship times, but in our lives as well. I personally see His goodness in so many of you, His meekness and gentleness in others, His love in most. There is a Holy Presence when we gather and if you're still and quiet and observant you can feel it and see it too.

Fifth, I appreciate the fact and the blessing for your . . .

Dedication to Christ, our Congregation, and our Community. I see this in your activities and in your support of the myriad of projects we undertake and the numerous missions we support. I see it when I'm out and about and many of you are out there too! I see it on Sunday mornings when I'm the only one who gets to see everyone's face. I see it in meetings and meals, at work and at play. I feel at home . . .

Sixth, I am the most appreciative for ... and what's really first in my heart ... is where we started on our list: **U**! When we put the list together, we find what I've been trying to convey say all along. And that is of course that I really appreciate being here at the **UNITED** Churches! You see Pastors Appreciation Day really is a two-sided story.
