Pastor's Pulpit:

I actually really like the month of November. The winter is settling in, golf is pretty much out of the picture for a few months, Thanksgiving is right around the corner, and of course ... the Christmas Holidays begin. It's sort of fitting that we end our year in our great country with holidays that celebrate the birth of our nation (Thanksgiving) ... in the specific sense of "public celebration acknowledging divine favors." Thanksgiving dates from the 1630's (the first one in America was held October 1621 by Plymouth Colony Pilgrims in appreciation of assistance from members of the Massasoit tribe and celebration of the first harvest.

And then of course, Christmas, as we as Americans still take time to consider the grace of God and His invitation to be born again through His Son and our Savior, Jesus Christ. Before we actually start a new year in January, we first take time to reflect and ponder, and try to get some new perspective about life and living, family, friends, and so on.

I love the HOLIDAYS! And I want us to consider 8 Christian assurances that each one of us who bear His name and image can indeed be thankful for.

Honor we are given in just being His. 1 John 5 states: ^{11"}And this is the testimony, that God gave us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. ¹²Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life." Of course, this eternal life is all about a secure and abundant life in the here and now. Do we have problems and ups and downs? Sure, but as a Believer, there is always the ongoing and heartfelt assurance that God has claimed me ... and changed me ... and I am heaven bound.

Second, we can be thankful for an . . .

O ngoing opportunity to approach our Heavenly Father at any time in every situation. John 16:23-24 states: "²³Truly, truly, I say to you, whatever you ask of the Father in my name, He will give it to you. ²⁴ Until now you have asked nothing in my name. Ask, and you will receive, that your joy may be full." With our heavenly Father, there is always one of three answers: yes, no or wait. James reminds us in chapter 4: "You desire and do not have, so you murder. You covet and cannot obtain, so you fight and quarrel. You do not have, because you do not ask." The simple fact is, we just forget to pray about things. I honestly believe that our God wants more of an ongoing conversation than just a constant barrage of I need this or I want that. The main point is we can have an ongoing dialog with God! He loves you, and it may surprise you, He actually likes you as well. He didn't make a mistake when He drew you to Himself and claimed you as His own.

Third, we can be thankful for a . . .

Life marked by Love. Paul understood this concept when he wrote in Ephesians 5: "Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children.² And walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God." The world does not understand our lives as Christians. But think about it. The Father loves you so much that He put in place a Divine plan to reconcile you to Himself though the act and action of His Son. The Son loved you enough to take upon Himself all of your sin and in return robe you with His righteousness. And the Holy Spirit loves you enough to take up residence in your heart and life as God's down payment and personal guarantee that you do belong to Him. Then of course He places us in a church family with like-minded, likehearted, like-loved folks. Living a life marked by love is not a determined action as much as it is a natural response of being a person who truly is loved.

Next we can be thankful for the . . .

ndwelling of the Holy Spirit. I know we've touched on this in our last item to be thankful \mathbf{L} for, but listen again to a couple of more verses that talk about this great privilege: Romans 8: "⁹ You, however, are not in the flesh but in the Spirit, if in fact the Spirit of God dwells in you. Anyone who does not have the Spirit of Christ does not belong to him. ¹⁰ But if Christ is in you, although the body is dead because of sin, the Spirit is life because of righteousness. ¹¹ If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ Jesus^[d] from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through his Spirit who dwells in you." Ephesians 1:14-16: "11 In him we have obtained an inheritance, having been predestined according to the purpose of him who works all things according to the counsel of his will, ¹² so that we who were the first to hope in Christ might be to the praise of his glory. ¹³ In him you also, when you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and believed in him, were sealed with the promised Holy Spirit, ¹⁴ who is the guarantee^[d] of our inheritance until we acquire possession of it,^[e] to the praise of his glory. So what really is the indwelling of the Holy Spirit? Think of is as God's continuous insider heavenly hug where He holds tightly to our hearts and whispers "I love you."

Then of course there is the ability to be thankful for ...

Daily assurance of His guidance. Provers 3 says: "My son, do not forget my teaching, but let your heart keep my commandments, ² for length of days and years of life and peace they will add to you. ³ Let not steadfast love and faithfulness forsake you; bind them around your neck; write them on the tablet of your heart. ⁴ So you will find favor and good success^[a] in the sight of God and man. ⁵ Trust in the LORD with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. ⁶ In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths."

This season we can be thankful for ...

A real hope of being in Heaven someday. Jesus said in John 14: "Let not your hearts be troubled. Believe in God;^[a] believe also in me.² In my Father's house are many rooms. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you?^{[b] 3} And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, that where I am you may be also. ⁴ And you know the way to where I am going.^{*[c] 5} Thomas said to him, "Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?" ⁶ Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." Page 2 of 7 The caveat there is we do know Jesus. What a great reality! We have found Him to be Our Way for us to find God, Our Truth provided for us to know God, and Our Life and Lifestyle marked out for us to be like God.

As well, we can be thankful for the reality that . . .

Y esterday's mistakes can stay in the yesterdays of our lives. Consider 1 John 1: "This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light, and in him is no darkness at all. ⁶ If we say we have fellowship with him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth. ⁷ But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. ⁸ If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. ⁹ If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. ¹⁰ If we say we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us." Yes we are Simul Justus et Peccador ... simultaneously justified and sinner, but the past is forgiven. The consequences? Well sometimes the consequences do have a lasting effect. But the guilt and the shame, and the regret, and the need to be selfcondemning all of the time? Nah, the past is the past. Our mistakes as well as our sinful deeds were hung on the Cross ... let them stay there!

And finally, as we begin to consider the upcoming Christmas season remember that our ...

S alvation is Preserved in Heaven for us. John 10 states, ²⁷ "My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me. ²⁸ I give them eternal life, and they will never perish, and no one will snatch them out of my hand. ²⁹ My Father, who has given them to me,^[a] is greater than all, and no one is able to snatch them out of the Father's hand. ³⁰ I and the Father are one."

So there you have it, 8 Assurances given to us as Believers. Things worth remembering during the upcoming **HOLIDAYS**.


CONCERT AT CUSTER COMMUNITY CHURCH:

If you would like to <u>make a donation toward building a shoebox</u>, use one of our giving envelopes and write *Shoeboxes* on the line designated for missions.


