A LITTLE CHURCH HISTORY

The Historic "Community Rooms". Many Hot Springs and United Churches meetings took place in this building in the 1930's-1950's. It was built before 1910 and was originally the Methodist Church. Location was where our Fellowship Hall is now.

The Methodist Episcopal Church was the first church building constructed in Hot Springs. The first service held in this church was on Sunday, August 7, 1887.

The building was called the "Community Rooms" after the Baptists, Methodists and Presbyterians united.

It was torn down in February 1954.
