Pastor's Pulpit:

Well here we are: a new year has begun! I wonder what it will be like? Frankly we just don't know! For some, anything would be an improvement. For others, it would be hard to beat all the great things that happened in 2021. For most of us, it's been a mixed bag; some good, some bad.

Personally, as far as our church goes, I think that this year is going to be great—maybe the best we've had in a while! After all, we do serve a great God. And He has given us His precious Word; words of comfort, words of encouragement, words of challenge. The scriptures remind us in Proverbs that having vision — a dream, a goal, a plan — is not only important, but a true life sustainer. Think about it, Proverbs 29:18a states: **"Where there is no vision, the people perish."** I like to look at it in a more positive sense believing that **IF there IS a vision then the people will prosper!** And that's what I want and am praying that 2022 will be: a year of growth, a year of gladness, a year of great things! For example, in January there are three great things happening in the life of our church.

The first event happening in the life of our church in January has to do with discipleship for our adults—AKA big kids. On January 2, at 11:15 AM, Disciple to Disciple is having its organizational meeting. Here's the honest truth about D2D: the only way I know of to grow our church is not merely to have a lot of new ideas or worship services or contemporary music—all these things can be good. And I'm all for trying whatever the Lord leads us to try or to do. But I do know this, if we are to procure the Lord's favor: or in other words if we want HIM to grow our church and send more people our way, then it's not simply a matter of what the Pastor or the Board can come up with. It's just not that simple. I have a vision that every member of our beloved congregation, old or new, be a Disciple that can (at least in theory and in expertise) have the ability to help another person become a true disciple of Christ. Won't you consider joining us for an initial class? For those of you who have had time conflicts and constraints in the past, could you come back aboard and pick up where you had to leave off? **Remember, where there is a vision the people will prosper.**

The second event has to do with discipleship for our young people. I was approached last year about starting a "Good News Club" (sponsored by Child Evangelism Fellowship). I shared this request with the Board of Trustees, who saw the great opportunity we could have to make a lasting impact in the lives of kids from our church and others who may join in. Good News Clubs have been around since 1937. They have a proven track record of solid, biblically-based, faith enhancing materials and activities.

Touch base with Jerry. And once again, let me point out: **where there is a vision the people will prosper.**

So there you have it, a new year, a new beginning, and just as an aside: January is just the starting point! It does feel, however, like we're getting off on the right foot. We have a great church family; we are blessed with a great facility; and yes, we do indeed have a vision. A vision that is meant to make us prosper!

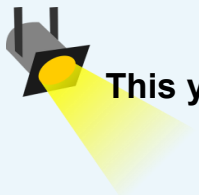

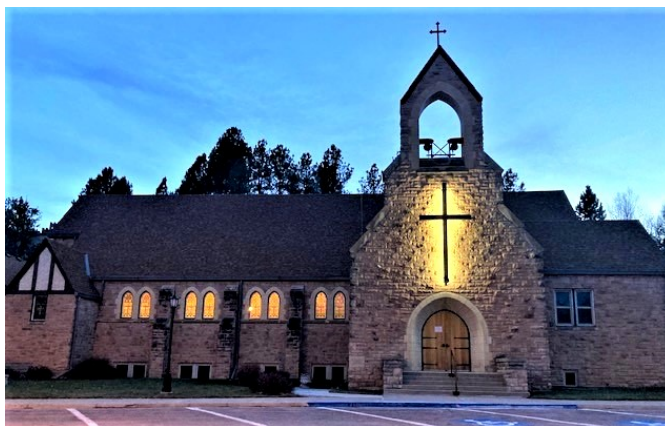
