

PASTOR'S PULPIT:

Dear Friends,

October is an important month in church life. It starts off with World Communion Sunday, a day with Christians from "east and west and north and south" share the elements from the Lord's Table as people who are "one in the Spirit and one in the Lord." Like Christmas and Easter, I have always thought of World Communion Sunday as one of those "never miss" Sundays.

October is often the month a church starts planning for the next year. Stewardship plans are often put into place and nominating committees start meeting I earnest. Churches often start developing the next year's budget in October as well.

October 19 at United Churches also means the return of the weekly Community Spaghetti Dinners. These dinners are a wonderful community service and I look forward to my first experience of one.

October then closes out with Reformation Sunday, a day to commemorate Martin Luther's posting of the 95 Theses on the door of the Wittenberg Church, which is seen as the start of the Reformation. This year marks the 500th anniversary of this act, making this year a time for a special commemoration. Therefore, Sunday, October 29 will be a special celebration of the Reformation and its impact on all Christians – Protestant, Catholic, and Orthodox.

Here are a few notes about the Reformation: Presbyterians and Baptists base much of their theology on the writings of John Calvin, a contemporary of Martin Luther. The theology of Methodism was developed by John Wesley, based on the work of Jacob Arminius, who disagreed with Calvin on several points. Over the centuries, however, those differences have moderated on both sides, and today the three denominations of Presbyterian (USA), United Methodist, and American Baptist agree on more theological points than they disagree. Even many of the differences between some Lutheran denominations and our three denominations have moderated as well. I find these moderations to be the result of healthy growth in our theological understandings of faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior.

On October 29, United Churches will also have a Potluck Dinner following worship. Everyone is invited to bring a dish (or two) to share for a time of great fellowship.

May this October be a time of joyful worship, meaningful growth, wonderful fellowship, and faithful mission at United Churches!
